5. Library Director Report, Morgan Taylor, MLS

Circulation and Collections:

- March 2023 circulation totaled 3,362
 - Increase of 14% from February 2023
 - o Increase of 12% from March 2022
- 141 items were added to the collection and 148 were withdrawn

Programming:

- 4 programs each for youth and adults as well as the NJ Madness bracket.
- For National Library Week take home crafts will be available
- Tuesday 4/25 is National Library Workers Day. The Board will be providing an appreciation lunch for staff.
- For June, the library is planning a LGBTQ+ collective book club

Community Engagement:

- 10 Orvil Court Improvements Committee met 4/13/23
- The Borough has hired a preconstruction management consultant to help with early steps.

First Quarter Highlights:

- Compared to this time last year, circulation is up for adult fiction, digital books and media, juvenile nonfiction
- Social Media reach up 244%, and foot traffic up 16%

National Library News:

• ALA tracks challenges on books/attempts to restrict library resources. Since 2020 the number of challenges have doubled each year. Materials, resources and displays. Challenges are coming from organizations or groups, rather than individuals. Themes usually relate to anti-racism, LGBTQ+ and sex education.

Youth Services:

- 1456 titles for youth circulation.
- Displays centered around St. Patrick's Day and Women's History month
- Programming included story times and offerings for NJ Makers Day .
- K. Cosenza is tracking data to drive program and activity planning.
- Summer reading planning is underway
